Lessons About Salvation...

Salvation is found in **Jesus alone!** (Romans 6:1-7)

Romans 6:3-4

3 Or don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? 4 We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life.

Have you found salvation in the person of Jesus Christ?

Salvation in His sacrifice is **final** and gives us **freedom** (Romans 6:8-14)

Romans 6:8-11

8 Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. 9 For we know that since Christ was raised from the dead, he cannot die again; death no longer has mastery over him. 10 The death he died, he died to sin once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. 11 In the same way, count yourselves dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Are you living in the freedom Jesus offers you?

The salvation we have in Jesus breaks **shackles** and brings **gifts** (Romans 6:15-23)

Romans 6:17-18 and 22-23

17 But thanks be to God that, though you used to be slaves to sin, you have come to obey from your heart the pattern of teaching that has now claimed your allegiance. 18 You have been set free from sin and have become slaves to righteousness.

22 But now that you have been set free from sin and have become slaves of God, the benefit you reap leads to holiness, and the result is eternal life. 23 For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Do you understand the greatness of the gift of grace?

Salvation frees us from the [law](#) and [binds](#) us to Jesus (Romans 7:16)

Romans 7:4

4 So, my brothers and sisters, you also died to the law through the body of Christ, that you might belong to another, to him who was raised from the dead, in order that we might bear fruit for God.

Are you bound up in legalism?

Salvation is not the end of [temptation](#) (Romans 7:7-25)

Romans 7:15-19

15 I do not understand what I do. For what I want to do I do not do, but what I hate I do. 16 And if I do what I do not want to do, I agree that the law is good. 17 As it is, it is no longer I myself who do it, but it is sin living in me. 18 For I know that good itself does not dwell in me, that is, in my sinful nature. For I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out. 19 For I do not do the good I want to do, but the evil I do not want to do—this I keep on doing.

Where is the battle raging?

Salvation frees us from [condemnation](#) (Romans 8:1-4)

Romans 8:1

Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus...

Do you believe the lies of the enemy?

Salvation unleashes the [power](#) and [presence](#) of the Spirit (Romans 8:5-11)

Romans 8:10-11

10 But if Christ is in you, then even though your body is subject to death because of sin, the Spirit gives life because of righteousness. 11 And if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies because of his Spirit who lives in you.

How can you walk more powerfully in the Spirit of the living God?

Salvation makes us [children](#) and [family](#) (Romans 8:12-17)

Romans 8: 15-17

15 The Spirit you received does not make you slaves, so that you live in fear again; rather, the Spirit you received brought about your adoption to sonship. And by him we cry, "Abba, Father." 16 The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God's children. 17 Now if we are children, then we are heirs—heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ, if indeed we share in his sufferings in order that we may also share in his glory.

Do you receive the invitations of your Abba?

Salvation [outweighs suffering](#) (Romans 8:18-25)

Romans 8:18

18 I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us.

Do you see the scales?

Salvation rewrites your story (Romans 8:26-30)

Romans 8:28

28 And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose.

Are you reading the old story or the new story?

Salvation gives victory and security (Romans 8:31-39)

Romans 8:37-39

37 No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. 38 For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, 39 neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Are you living as more than a conqueror?
